YORUBA

This term, your child will learn listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in Yoruba that will help promote our cultural heritage.

FRENCH

Your child will learn four major skills in the French language: listening, speaking, reading and writing. These help students to comprehend and produce spoken language for proper and effective interpersonal communication.

IGBO LANGUAGE

The children will be introduced to the grammar of Igbo language so as to learn to read, write and speak the language. Focus shall also be on the various aspects of Igbo culture and ethics.

MUSIC

At the end of the term, all learners will have improved both in vocal and instrumental skills. They will also be able to create good music with their improved skills.

SOCIAL STUDIES

This term, focus will be on the development of positive values, norms and attitude to thrive in the society. Your ward will also appreciate cultures and cultural differences for global relevance.

CULTURAL AND CREATIVE ART

Creativity shall be blended with talent through culture-driven projects that are channelled towards global impact.

DRAMA

Drama for this term will be centred around the origin and elements of drama as well as the various aspects of theatre and theatrical production involving acting, stage direction and play production.

Agricultural Science

Students shall explore the importance of agriculture, classes and uses of crops and classes and uses of farm animals. Moreover, methods of weed and pest control and factors of agricultural production shall also be scrutinised.

Physical & Health Education

In this term, learners shall be exposed to the importance of physical and health education, history and pioneers of physical Education in Nigeria, physical fitness and body conditioning programme, track and field events, sports and games, and nutrition.

Home Economics

This term, we will be looking at the importance of Home Economics to an individual, family and nation.

Biology

Children will learn about cells, classification of life, environment, ecosystem and community health.

Physics

Students, along with their teacher, will discuss energy and its forms. They will also study the solar system and its satellites as well as space travel.

Chemistry

This term, the students will learn to classify matter, metal and non-metal elements, compound and mixture, state of matter, as well as chemical and physical properties of matter.

Business Studies

At the end of the term, your child will have an informed knowledge of all the basic components of the subject. These components include office practice, book-keeping, commerce and keyboarding.

Christian Religious Studies

At the end of the term, we hope to understand God's orderly nature from the first account of creation as recorded in genesis chapter one. We shall also look at the concept of marriage.

History

The expectation is for students to possess the skills necessary for interpreting, analysing and applying the historical knowledge acquired so as to solve present challenges and to predict the future for the good of humanity.

Basic Technology

We shall focus on key topics namely: technology, safety and properties of materials.

Islamic Religious Studies

We shall introduce Qur'an, Hadith, Tawhid, Fiqh, Sirah and Tahdhib.

Civic Education

Children will learn to take responsibilities within democratic states, to know their civic duties as well as exercise their rights as citizens.
